Dear Parents and Carers

Change to Mobile Phone Policy

We have found this year that allowing mobile phones in 'phone zones' and at social times in school has not worked. Too often, issues related to mobile phones and messaging cause conflict and upset. Aside from this safeguarding issue, recent research has shown that the effect of banning mobile phones from school premises adds up to the equivalent of an extra week's schooling over a child's academic year.

From September, mobile phones will no longer be allowed to be seen or used on school site at any part of the day. Students may have them kept on silent or off in a bag, but the rule is, if we see it, it will be confiscated until the end of the day. It is more important than ever that students bring a bag to school to keep equipment safe in. The full mobile phone policy will be shared with you all on the school website shortly.

September arrangements

We look forward to welcoming all students back to school on Monday 5th of September at 8.30am. We have a busy year ahead of us, with a range of changes and improvements to the school planned. Please support us by getting your child ready with full uniform for that first day back – we start as we mean to go on, with uniform just one focus for improvement in September.

Students have really taken on board the values they helped choose earlier this year, of Respect, Responsibility and Kindness. We look forward to continuing to guide students in 2022-23 to be respectful, responsible and kind at every opportunity.
